Governor Vote for not more than 1	Governor Vote for not more than 1	<p>Shall Kent County levy .50 of one mill which equals 50 cents per \$1,000 of the taxable value on all real and personal property subject to taxation for the period 2022 through 2029, inclusive, for the purpose of planning, evaluating, and providing services to persons age 60 years or older? Millage for this purpose was approved in 1998, 2006 and 2014. It is the same as the .50 of one mill levy for the above listed services approved by voters that expired in 2021. The amount raised by the levy in the first calendar year is estimated at \$13,800,000.</p> <p>In Kent County there are 31 local authorities that capture and use, for authorized purposes, tax increment revenues from property taxes levied by the County. Such capture could include a portion of this millage levy. This continues the .050 mill for veterans services originally approved by voters in 2014. The amount raised by the levy in the first calendar year is estimated at \$1,327,856.</p> <p>In Kent County there are 31 local authorities that capture and use, for authorized purposes, tax increment revenues from property taxes levied by the County. Such capture could include a portion of this millage levy.
