C. Wayfinding

a. Staging Area - "Business District"

Beier remarked that he thought a business district sign was unnecessary and stated that the previous sign was not maintained. **Powell** stated that she would like to see a sign similar to the parking sign that said "Welcome to Cedar Springs sign with Business District" on it as well. **Ringler** stated that he would also like to see a sign at 17 Mile and 18 Mile. **Vriesenga** thought the sign at Maple should be double sided.

D. Bike Rack

Vriesenga reported that he hasn't been able to get ahold of the bike rack company because they appear to be seasonal. **Ringler** stated that PA186C is the standard red. **Womack** said that the surface mount that was installed in front of City Hall had been knocked over during Red Flannel Day. **Gebhardt** would like to see a galvanized option. **Ringler** would like to have the DPW Director at the next meeting to assist in determining the best fit for the city.

E. City Flag

Ringler thought that the design provided at the last meeting would be a good option for a city flag because it is open source. **Womack** remarked that public input on a city flag would be necessary.

Hopkins stated that he would like to explore lighting both sides of the street lanterns. He reported that during the financial crisis they cut power to half of the lanterns to conserve power. He was also glad to have multiple boards working together.
